



# TALBOT HORIZON LX and GLX

The 1985 Horizon range offers two new petrol-engined versions – the LX and GLX. Both share fresh exterior colour styling and co-ordinated interior schemes. These latest models are eye-catchers. Metallic paint finish is standard, and the aerodynamic full wheel covers and radiator grille take the body colour. The wheel trims are accented with a triple decorative stripe while the line of the body is emphasised by a matching stripe above the deep section protective body side mouldings. Both the LX and GLX have front air dams and the GLX specification includes tinted glass. However you look at these two new Horizons their visual impact is unique.

The LX combines economy with style. The 1294 cc engine develops 65 BHP (PS-DIN) at 5600 rpm and with its 5-speed gearbox returns up to 47.9 mpg at a constant 56 mph. The GLX enjoys the extra performance available from a 1442 cc 83 BHP (PS-DIN) engine but even so is still capable of over 47 mpg at a constant 56 mph. For the family or the business motorist therefore the Horizon LX and GLX offer the ideal choice of power and performance with similar style and running economy.

Both models surround the driver and passengers with high levels of comfort and equipment. Seat facings and the front head restraints are

trimmed in velour. The front doors have hockey-stick armrests, velour insert panels, and door pockets, plus loudspeakers for the standard push button radio/stereo cassette player. For added convenience the GLX is fitted with central door locking. The passenger compartment is fully carpeted while the load area with 43.0 cu.ft. of space available with the rear seat folded down, has its own vinyl mat.

On the instrument display both models have new graphics plus a comprehensive array of warning lights. The heater and ventilation controls are illuminated for night driving and there are side window demisters. For all-round visibility in any conditions these new Horizons have load-adjustable halogen headlamps, two door mirrors and a dipping interior mirror, plus a heated rear screen with wash/wipe.

The all-independent suspension system, 155/82 SR 13 tyres and disc/drum servo-assisted brakes maintain the Horizon's reputation for superlative road manners in all conditions, further enhanced on the GLX by the added convenience of power assisted steering. With a 12 months unlimited mileage warranty and the 6-year anti-perforation warranty, the reliability of electronic ignition and other low-maintenance design features, these new LX and GLX models are the definitive light hatchbacks for 1985.
